

# Alouettes chop Milt Crain

MONTREAL (CP) — Montreal Alouettes of the Eastern Football Conference released three players on waivers Tuesday, including Milt Crain, veteran All-Star centre in his sixth year with the team.

The Als also picked up three National Football League cuts for the usual five-day tryout. They are halfback Paul Dudley, end John Baker and tackle Dick Bowman.

Also put on waivers were Montreal native Dick Aboud, sophomore linebacker, and tackle Peter Lewis, a rookie recruit from the University of British Columbia.

Heaviest man on the roster at 257 pounds, Crain, 26, who also played offensive tackle, has been in coach Jim Trimble's dog-house this year for uninspiring play.

Coach Trimble said if Aboud or Lewis are not picked up by other Canadian Football League teams for the waiver price, they will be

sent to the Als' Portland Sea Hawks farm team. Aboud has been idle since last July with a shoulder injury.

Trimble also announced that flanker Willie Lambert has been removed from the injury list, and will be ready for the Alouettes' next game, at Regina Sept. 7 against Saskatchewan Roughriders. Lambert had been out with a hand injury.

Placed back on the injury list were veterans Ferdie Burket, a fullback, tackle Dick Dalatri, and halfback Meco Poliziani, all victims of torn knee ligaments.

Added to the roster in Crain's place was Charles Harris, a 252-pound tackle cut of the Pittsburgh Steelers who has been in Montreal for the last few weeks waiting for an opening on the squad. Trimble said Harris will start at defensive tackle in the Regina game.

Dudley comes to the Alou-

ettes from Philadelphia Eagles. An offensive and defensive half, he weighs 195 pounds.

The six-foot-three Baker, two-way end, was cut by Green Bay Packers, while two-way tackle Bowman, who weighs 245 pounds, was released by St. Louis Cardinals.

Trimble said he has abandoned the two-quarterback system he's been using this season, and will dress either rookie George Bork or experienced Vernon Cole in future games.
