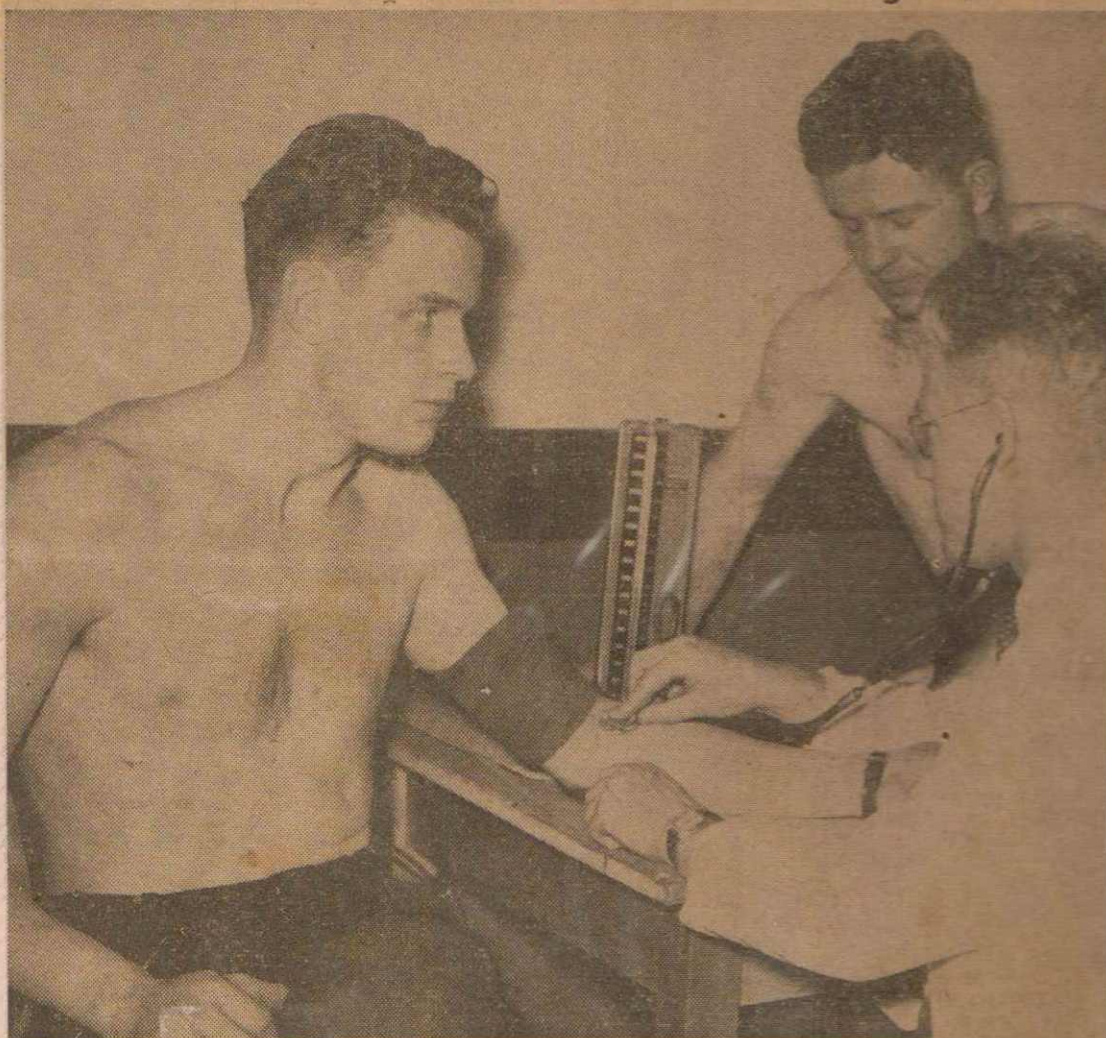


## Gordie Noseworthy Plans to Hoist 'Em High, as Pilot
