

Jewish Holiday To Keep Three Alouettes Idle

Lew Hayman, the man responsible for the senior football rejuvenation in Montreal, is not sporting an ear-to-ear grin as he contemplates his Alouette lineup for the Big Four football tussle with the Rough Riders Saturday afternoon at Lansdowne Park. The Jewish Day of Atonement, covering from sundown Friday to sundown Saturday, will keep three and possibly five members of the Hayman cast on the shelf while the Alouettes attempt to protect their hold on second place against the Riders.

Joey Richman, fleet half; Norm Segalowitz, an Ottawa boy who is sharing part of Montreal's kicking burden and Benny Steck, inside wing are the three Hebrew athletes with Alouettes who definitely will not participate in the Lansdowne Park fixture. So The Citizen was informed by a Montreal spokesman in a long-distance telephone conversation late Wednesday night.

The same spokesman reported that the Jewish holiday may also keep Lou Mogul, middle wing and Dave Greenburg quarterback out of the game, although there has been no official statement regarding this pair.

At the same time, the Riders will be minus their lone Jewish player, Moe Segal, who plays inside wing. Moe did not play in last Saturday's game here against Argos because he had been forced to miss three practices last week due to the Jewish New Year holidays.

Segal, along with the other athletes on the Montreal roster will be ready for duty in the Sunday game at Montreal. The Jewish holiday will give the Alouettes an edge in this respect, because the Jewish boys missing the Lansdowne Park game will be fresh material for Hayman when the teams wind up their two-day series in Montreal's huge baseball park.
